

Janet Green passed OTS and has been promoted to Ensign.



Paramount Home Video releases

"Farpoint", "The Naked Now" and "Code of Honor." They will be full stereo cassettes with teasers for the following episode. (Columbia House Video is already packaging "Special Edition" cassettes.)

Writers Hilary J. Bader, Susan Sackett & Fred Bronson, Larry J. Conley and Eric Stillwell have sold scripts to ST:TNG for season five. GNP Crescendo has released a follow up "Next Generation" album featuring Ron Jones' music from 'The Best of Both Worlds." Parts One and Two. Filming of STAR TREKVI: THE UNDISCOVERED COUNTRY has been completed. African model Iman ("No Way Out") plays Martia, a shapeshifting alien, while actor Kurtwood Smith ("True Believer," "Oscar") plays the Federation President. Kim Cattrall ("Mannequin," "Big Trouble in Little China") is Valerius, and Christopher Plummer ("The Sound of Music") is Klingon General Chang.

Personality Comics has just released via comic form, of course - the first in a series of Star Trek unauthorized biographies, featuring William Shatner. One for Patrick Stewart is next on their list, followed by others in the "Trek" set. Probe may be scheduled for a January release after all; Pocket Books has neither confirmed nor denied it. The ST:TNG Technical Manual has been delayed for a November release, while the 25th Anniversary book by Gene Roddenberry and Susan Sackett has also been delayed, until the end of the year (problems with one of the actors portrayed

in the book).

STAR TREKVI may be in for a little bit of a ride. Rumors from the set abound that

Paramount wishes to refilm a few scenes to leave a possible TREK VII open, and the end of TREK VI doesn't really do that.

Nothing definite yet.

Speaking of TREK VI, the special effects departments of **ILM** are now underway finalizing much of the footage they've been set to do. Among their achievements will be the **Enterprise** and **Excelsior**, a Klingon vessel, a shapeshifting alien, planets galore and more. Director Meyer is assisting in some work.

A new Star Trek computer game will be released September 15th. "Will combine 'Wing Commander'-like flight sequences with Sierra-style planetary explorations". Previous computer games have proven to be been unimpressive.
