



The Trek Chef

Over the years, we've been exposed to a great deal of culinary variety in the ST universe. We've seen Vulcan "plomeek soup" from Classic Trek ("Amok Time") and the noxious Klingon "gagh" from STTNG. We've seen a formal diplomatic buffet ("Journey to Babel") and the interior of a well-appointed ship's galley (STVI-even though starships are supposed to be routinely equipped with food synthesizers). We've encountered ubiquitous "Saurian brandy" in its funny bottle and the contraband "Romulan ale." This is but the tip of the tip of the culinary iceberg, so to speak, but let's look at these things a little more closely.

First, the "plomeek soup" is simple enough to identify. Since Vulcans are known to be vegetarians, we can only conclude that this is some kind of vegetarian broth, with or without some kind of carbohydrate filler (noodles, etc.). I had trouble accepting the presence of a full galley on a starship in STVI. Not only is it a waste of valuable space, but with the availability of food synthesizers, it seems a waste of trained personnel time to prepare food by hand ("I went to the Academy for four years for this?"). On the other hand, perhaps there are special formal occasions, like the reception in "Journey to Babel" and the dinner in STVI which require the preparation of individual

dishes not available through the synthesizers.

However, even in the 23rd century when food and drink are routinely dispensed from a handy wall synthesizer, I hope some things--like Scotty's favorite single-malt whisky--will continue to be lovingly produced by hand!

"Loud as a Wisper" - Data has learned sign language and is now interpreting what the mediator [Reeva] is saying. Data quotes the mediator as saying "My friends have died" or something like that, before it is even signed.

"Yesterday's Enterprise" - At the end of the episode, Geordi talks with Guinan. However, he is wearing an open neck uniform.

"The Drumhead" - After the first hearing with J'Ddan, Worf and J'Ddan leave the briefing room. The doors open as they are walking through the doorway, the doors start to close, but hesitate, then open back up, and then close after they leave the doorway. Looks like someone pulled on the ropes too soon.

"Sins of the Father" - The sound-affects people must have fallen asleep everytime someone got slapped.

"Half A Life" - Near the end of the episode, when Lwaxana Troi is standing next to the mirror and then begins to walk away from it, for a brief instant the boom from the mic is visible in the reflection.
