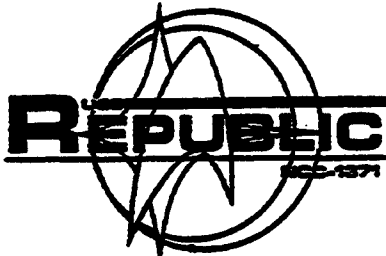

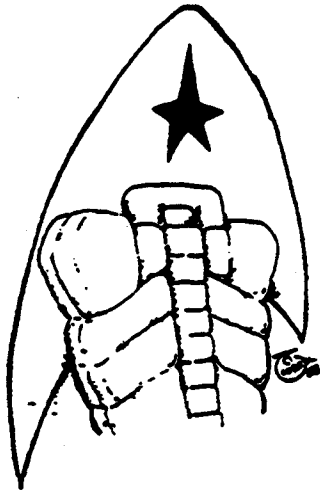

My thanks to our captain for having enough confidence in me to ask me to be his exec. I hope that I can live up to his expectations--and yours.

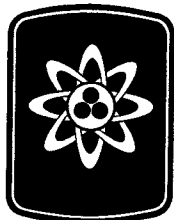

SICK BAY

Several local clubs, including the Republic, are currently planning participation in this year's Muscular Dystrophy Association fundraising activities. As most of you know, muscular dystrophy is a group of diseases in which muscle fibers undergo progressive damage and eventual destruction. The diseases are considered hereditary, and most often become evident in early childhood, although some forms affect adults. Some women with no clinical evidence of the disease are carriers; Some of their sons may have the disease, their daughters may be carriers. Testing includes muscle tests, biopsies, and blood tests for certain enzymes (especially CPK or creatine phosphokinase) displayed in high levels in people with the disease and in carriers. There is no cure; principal treatment is in the area of physical therapy, braces, and other supportive measures.

It is distressing to think of the thousands of people afflicted with this disease, mostly small children who cannot run and skip and jump, and sometimes cannot even dress or feed themselves. It certainly makes me stop and think when I complain that I am always so busy; I need to be grateful for the fact that I am able to do so many things. There is always hope for a breakthrough in treatment or even a cure, especially now with the field of genetics making such great strides almost daily.

We would very much like for as many Republic members as possible to assist or volunteer in these fundraising activities to support medical research and development. We will be doing something to help some people who really need support, and we will be having fun at the same time. Most people do not have a lot of spare time these days and hesitate to volunteer; but just an hour from several different people adds up to a lot of hours in the long run; if you can help out more, that would be fantastic! If you are interested

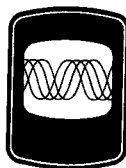

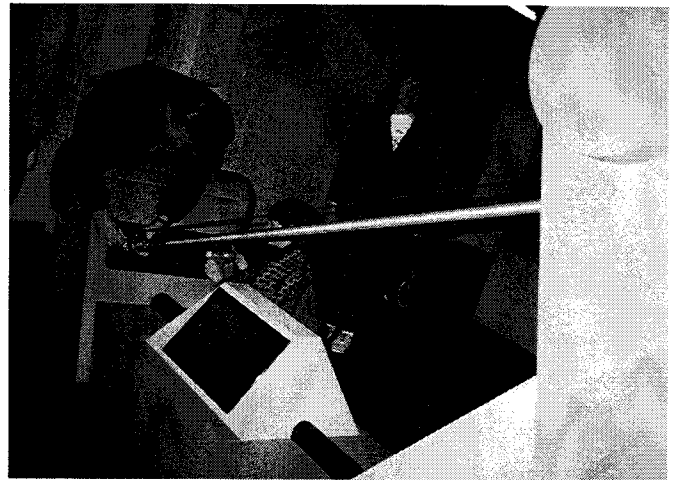
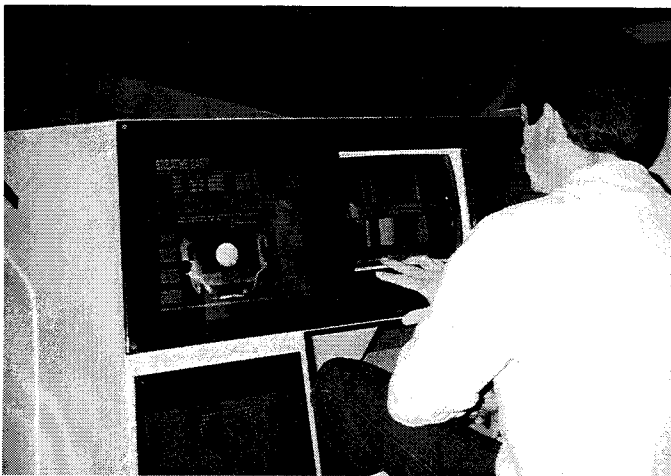
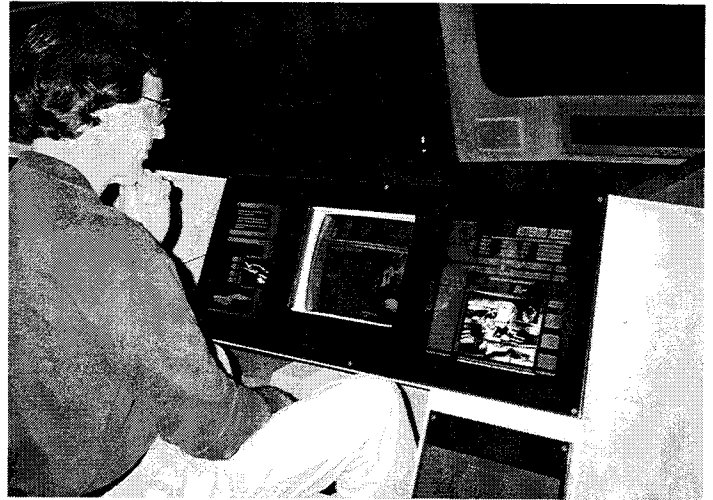
Last summer we decided to choose SciTrek as our primary charity. Afterwards we discovered that they were to host **STAR TREK: Federation Science** next January. Over the next several months we participated in monthly meetings with the SciTrek staff and other Trek clubs in metro Atlanta to help plan our involvement in this exhibit. Today a full third of the Republic is participating in staffing this exhibit with an extra effort to staff the overnight sessions on two occasions. The Republic's involvement will not end after this exhibit departs. We will be training in the next exhibit shortly and hope to continue on with our relationship with SciTrek.

For those of you who don't know anything about this exhibit I'd like to tell you something about it. First, it was designed and built by the Oregon Museum of Science and Industry and has been touring the country since September 1992. The exhibit's purpose is to promote science and technology literacy among people of all ages using the **STAR TREK** theme to gain interest, excitement and participation. The exhibit consists of several areas, The Bridge, Engineering, Sick Bay, Transporter Room, Science Station & Life Support. Each of these areas consists of interactive stations which grab the attention and stimulate the mind of the participant. The Bridge has touch screen stations linked to the view screen to reward a successful completion of a mission. Engineering uses touch screens to teach about matter/anti-matter and gravity. Science Station & Life Support explores what it takes to live in space as well as how we can find habitable planets. Transporter Room is an interactive "virtual reality" where you beam down to a planet and interact with your surroundings. Sick Bay delves into maintaining your health and today's equivalent to **STAR TREK's** future medical equipment. Please keep in mind the above descriptions are only general. To fully appreciate this exhibit you **MUST** come and see for yourself. My humble words can't fully do it justice. But hurry! This exhibit leaves May 3. The next stop is Boston MA. If you would like more information about this exhibit please contact me and help you out as much as I can. See you there!

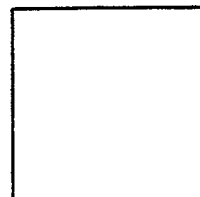
