BY-LAWS AMENDMENTS

Because of the publishing date change for the ATTR, the by-laws need to be changed to reflect the increased time between issues to get the word out to members on important issues raised during an election. I propose that all nominations must be turned in by Labor Day, with the next issue of the ATTR to publish said nominations and campaigns of the candidates. Elections will take place at the first meeting in December since the second is too close to Christmas to make a reasonable turnout. The winner will be announced at the next meeting and published in the next ATTR. He will take office January 1st. Should no candidates be nominated and the current CO does not step down, it will be considered a vote of confidence of the current CO and his administration. These by-laws will be discussed at both August meetings.
