On a side note many were interested in my Next Gen dinner jacket. I purchased



Communique and Online Database

If you are not receiving your CQ's (your Starfleet newspaper) you should check to see that your address in the Membership Database is correct. And if it is wrong, you should correct it.

You now can ensure your information is correct for yourselves, whenever you want. EVERY member has a username and password to the new online Membership Database. You can find the database from the www.sfi.org website or go directly to the database at: http://database.sfi.org.

If you do not have your username and password, you can ask your CO to give you your Username Name and Password or you can send an email to the Help Desk requesting this information.

If you send an email to the Help Desk, helpdesk@sfi.org please include your name, SCC#, address, etc, so that we can verify that you are who you say you are.

Once you log in, go to the Member Tab under 'Change Account Info' and look over your address. If it is wrong, then correct it and submit the changes to Computer Operations.

If your address is correct, and you are still not receiveing CQs, then you have several options.

 For domestic US Members, go to www.usps.com and check your address versus what the United States Post Office has listed for you. For non-Domestic US members, go to your Local Post Office and check your address there.

Then make sure the database and your post office are in sync.

Note: If your membership is expired, you will not be able to log into the database until you renew. You can renew online by going to the SFI Website and choosing Renew Online. You can do this without having to log into the database. If you choose Join/New Membership instead of Renew, you will get issued a new SCC Number and account, and your existing account will not be renewed, so please choose Renew if you are an existing member.

And remember, for all CQs that you have not received, send your email to lostcq@sfi.org.

March 22, 2003 The USS
DaVinci will be celebrating its
7th anniversary and they would like
to invite anyone who wishes to come to
join them for a fun-filled day! This
should be the one event you don't want
to miss if you can't help it.

Now I know what you are thinking, that this takes places the 2 weeks after the Summit and one week after Saint Patrick's Day and most of you have little time and money left. That may be true, but if you do not come, you will be missing a once in a lifetime opportunity!

Because of his years of voluntary service to the Coca-Cola Space Science Center in Columbus, the head of the Center has kindly offered Joe and up to 38 of his friends the opportunity to run a mission. The Space Science Center houses a Challenger Learning Center. These centers were established in the name of the Challenger astronauts, who lost their lives in 1986, with the mandate of furthering space science education. to what would be on the ISS. In conjunction with the group at 'mission control', they proceed through the mission. At the halfway point, the two groups switch places. It takes about 2-2 1/2 hours and is a lot of fun.

Now for the exciting news! The cost to Joe and his friends will be ZERO! That is right, it is FREE! What an opportunity to experience what it is like to run a mission! This is now even truer since the tragic loss of the Columbia crew. What we would like to do is get a \$5.00 donation from all who attend. Half the money will go to the Region for its various charities and half will go to the DaVinci and its charity.

These are the tentative plans. The mission will take place on Saturday, March 22nd at approximately 11:00 AM. Following the mission we will adjourn to the Captain's house for food and good times. For those of you who wish to spend the night, Connie and Freddy (and I am sure others on the DaVinci will too) will offer you a place to lay your head for the evening. They once housed 12 Klingons following a convention so they are quite experienced in that regard! Freddy says, "If you wish to come on Friday evening, you are welcome to stay with us."
