

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


We would also like to congratulate the newest ships in the Region which were both commissioned at the Summit:

56-foot statue of Vulcan on the summit of Red Mountain, overlooking downtwn Birmingham



Tox Television's late-night irreverent hit "Mad TV" is modeled deliberately after "Saturday Night Live." A Mad TV skit on Saturday evening, March 15, 1998 addressed the possibility that ST lived beyond its original cancellation by becoming a direct competitor of the old Rowan & Martin "Laugh-In" show. (Fans will remember that in ST's third season, the show was promised a spot next to Laugh-In, which would have guaranteed a strong lead-in audience, but was instead relegated to late Friday night, a schedule which effectively killed the show.) The skit presented the "Kirk & Spock Variety Hour," complete with the Dancing Tribbles chorus line, a green Orion go-go girl, and lots of stand-up humor ("Spock it to me, baby!"). "Kirk's" opening monologue included the desire for "a star date with someone whose personal phasers are set on stunning."

ax Grodénchik, who appears as "Rom" in DS9, had a small part as a 30s-era gangster in the Walt Disney movie *The Rocketeer* several years ago; the gangster's name was "Wilmer." "Wilmer" was also the name of the petty hood in the classic 1941 Humphrey Bogart flick *The Maltese Falcon*. That character of "Wilmer" was played by Elisha Cook, Jr.—who showed up 25 years later in the Classic ST episode "Court Martial" as "Samuel T. Cogley," the unreconstructed lawyer who distrusted computers.

olm Meaney narrates the audio book *The Irish in America*, a collection of essays by various writers exploring the trials and tribulations and contributions

of our Celtic immigrants. The review, by Deirdre Donahue, which appeared in *USA Today* on April 3, 1996, stated "The best thing about this audio book has to be Irish actor Colm Meaney's voice, with its authentic brogue and rich, emotional tone."

#### Star Trek in Everyday Life

A brief feature in *Newsweek* magazine for March 9, 1998 was titled "Starfleet Academy." The article itself had nothing to do with ST, of course; in fact, ST wasn't even mentioned—the writer just assumed that the average reader would understand the reference to the UFP's premiere educational institution. The article discussed "a career as a space-traffic controller": "With more than 200 satellites already in orbit and another 1,300 set to launch during the next decade, the cosmos



is going to need to some crowd control. Industry analysts worry that without properly trained ground control crews to steer them through space, satellites could easily hurtle into one another in a kind of heavenly demolition derby." NASA has contracted with Allied Signal Technical Services to begin training the new breed of traffic controller; classes begin in April 1998.

The Star Trek Chronology, by Michael and Denise Okuda (newly updated to include material from First Contact)

This is a fascinating and yet disappointing tour through the world of ST—past, present, and future. The cross-references are thought-provoking, laying out in order all the persons and events of our ST universe. However, in the introduction, the authors make clear that they rely exclusively on only the several television series and feature films. With but a single exception, they deliberately disregard the highly acclaimed animated series, and the novels are ignored altogether. This methodology results in some strange omissions. Uhura has no given name listed—"she has never had one." Yet fans are nearly unanimous that her name has been accepted to be Nyota; how can the Okudas just totally ignore this? Also, the animated series features Captain Robert April in one episode ("The Counterclock Incident") and Diane Carey's excellent novel "Final Frontier" also features him, along with a very young James T. Kirk and Kirk's father, George. We know that Gene Roddenberry created the character of "Robert April," first captain of the fabled Enterprise (later changed to "Robert Winter" and then to Christopher Pike), but there is no reference to April anywhere in the Okudas' "standard" chronology; this information has been supplied by the fans themselves. Although the Okudas have made clear their reverence for the original sources and their reasons for not considering all other sources, their book

still leaves disturbing holes in an otherwise thoroughly researched and well organized chronology. One aspect of the book which is really quite interesting is a separate section on time travel, discussing various stories which can only be accounted for in "parallel universes" or "alternative timelines."

#### Ravings From the Editor . . .



Readers of my regularly scheduled editorial columns know how frequently I rail against pseudoscience, "ancient astronauts," crystal therapy, and other blatantly unscientific

and totally unfounded popular myths. An article in *USA Today* on April 7, 1998 was headlined "Mars 'Face' Just a Pile of Rocks." The headline referred to a widely reproduced photograph of the Martian landscape taken by NASA's Viking I in 1976 that some people believe to be an artifact or structure—like the Sphinx or Pyramids—left over from a vanished Martian civilization. It supposedly shows a



"face"—rather like the "man in the moon" face—of shadows and bright spots. Finally, 22 years later, a picture transmitted from NASA's Global

Surveyor shows the same terrain under different lighting, and reveals nothing more than "erosional remnants of rock shaped either by wind or water" according to Arden Albee, project scientist at Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena, California. "It looks like the Badlands of South Dakota." Naturally, the true believers (or at least those with a financial stake in preserving the fiction of ancient Martian ruins) immediately blasted the pictures. Richard Hoagland, author of The Monuments of Mars, criticized the photographs as being of poor quality: "There's all kinds of random speckles." Supporters of a "conspiracy" theory that NASA is hiding the truth (including various nuts on the Internet) will never be convinced of the photograph's veracity, of course, since the absence of proof of a conspiracy is itself proof that a conspiracy exists. Such circular logic can be used to "prove" absolutely anything and is a central factor in all conspiracy theories.



As fans of the ST universe, we know that science is a rational, logical process. The most amazing advances in our universe (warp drive, transporter technology,

medicine) are based on proven scientific principles extrapolated into the foreseeable future. There is no room in the ST universe for pseudoscientific junk and "conspiracy" theories. The genuine truth of the cosmos is far more awesome and awe-inspiring than any "ancient Martian monuments" some fruitcake can dream up.



#### Keeping An Eye on the Universe

Most biologists believe that life on Earth began in the "primordial ooze" or "organic soup" presumed to have blanketed the planet eons ago. New research, reported in the Atlanta Journal and Constitution on Sunday, April 12, 1998 ("A Rocky Start") suggests that possibly life began on the rocks—or actually in them. University of Chicago geophysicist Joseph Smith hypothesizes that life—like the most tenacious forms of lichens found in the inhospitable polar regions—started with "concentrations of fragile biomolecules in locations proximate to each other, rather than dispersed in sea water, where they would be protected from lethal solar radiation." In light of the recent revelations of Martian microbes found in fossilized rocks, Smith believes that Earthly life began in porous rocks which contained a high degree of rich minerals that could absorb organic molecules from the water around them and shelter them while chains of polymers formed. His "candidate rock" is called mutinaite, found primarily in Antarctica.



There have been some recent doomsday scenarios concerning a possible collision

with Earth on October 26, 2028 by an asteroid that was originally predicted to pass within 30,000 miles of our home planet—well within the orbit of the Moon. Subsequent calculations placed the asteroid's approach at something like

600,000 miles—a trajectory that is certainly a close shave by astronomical standards, but still well outside any conceivable danger zone. (An article in the Atlanta Constitution for Thursday, March 12, 1998 was entitled "Earth Faces Close Pass by Asteroid.") After the sensationalistic scare passed, follow-up news in both the AC ("Pondering the Paths of Those Asteroids"; Sunday, March 15) and in Newsweek ("Never Mind!"; March 23, 1998) discussed the fact of unknown space rocks hurtling through the cosmos and the actual chances of Earth being hit by one with little or no notice. The AC article was subtitled "Wayward Space Rubble Has Scientists Worried," and the Newsweek feature stated "There are literally thousands of uncharted asteroids and comets with the celestial equivalent of 'road rage'—they keep speeding out of their orbital lanes and wind up in ours." Aside from the minipanic caused by inaccurate predictions of imminent disaster, both follow-up articles discussed the real facts facing astronomers trying to predict the dangers of space debris. One only has to remember seeing the fantastic pictures a year or so ago of the fragments of Comet Shoemaker-Levy crashing into Jupiter to think what could happen here.

An article in the Atlanta Journal for Saturday, February 28, 1998 was titled "UFO Investigator Group Drawn by the

Unexplained." It detailed a local gathering of the MUFON organization (Mutual UFO Network), a 25-year-old association "that meets to compare notes about strange

things in the sky and share knowledge with the public." Tom Sheets, the state director of MUFON, is quoted as saying "We're trying to get across the fact that UFOs are a real phenomenon. . . . We don't understand the phenomenon, but what we try to do is investigate sightings, learn more about what's out there, and emphasize that you're not crazy if you have a sighting." The most notable aspect of this article is that it was reported as "straight news"; that is, there were no cutesy references to "little green men" or "X-Files." The writer states that "MUFON members say they often are ridiculed but continue seeking answers for the unexplained."

And speaking of comets, an article in the December 1997 issue of *National Geographic* ("The Age of Comets" with some stunning color pictures) provided a fascinating look into the existence

of these cosmic wanderers. On most occasions in history, these stellar objects have provoked awe and terror; comet appearances are presumed to presage tragedies: The Saxons were terrified when Halley's Comet appeared in 1066AD, and of course, William the Conqueror changed British history forever that year. The Aztec emperor Montezuma II saw "a flaming ear of corn" in the heavens in 1517AD, and lost all heart for fighting the invading Spanish conquistadores. But not all comets were portents of doom. A comet seen in Rome shortly after the assassination of Julius Caesar in 44BC was supposed to be confirmation of his godhood. The danger of these spacefaring snowballs is that there are so many of them and their orbits are incredibly erratic. Halley's Comet has a predictable 87-year term; other comets

appear once and are "slingshotted" by the Sun's gravity out of the solar system forever (as happened in 1990); still others have terms so long as to be meaningless (a comet discovered in 1996 will return in "about 20,000AD" and a comet discovered in 1997 will return in "about 4400AD," according to the article). Because the orbits of many comets are erratic, they can be easily influenced by any celestial body they approach, and can thereafter be thrown off on an entirely new and sometimes unpredictable trajectory. For example, last year's Hale-Bopp Comet was calculated to have a period of 4,200 years, but after leaving our vicinity and passing too close to Jupiter, the estimated period has been cut nearly in half, to 2,400 years (watch for it!). 🗭

May 9th—Republic 10th Anniversary Party. Place still tentative at McGill Park in Atlanta, which is where Kelly and I live.



The Atlanta metropolitan area's oldest STARFLEET chapter began as the Shuttle Nautilus, attached to the USS Perseus, NCC-544, Columbus, Georgia, and was commissioned the USS Republic, NCC-1371, at Dixie Trek in 1988. The Republic is an Excelsior-class heavy cruiser modeled after the Excelsior of STIII and STVI. With a crew of about 35, the Republic serves as the flagship of Starfleet's Region 2 and coordinates the activities of Starfleet Atlanta with the USS MacLeod. The Republic was the mothership for the former Shuttle Alacrity (now the USS Alacrity, NCC-1881), stationed in Memphis.

In addition to picnics, con parties, and visits to Fernbank Science

Center, the Republic's community activities have included sending a fully uniformed away team to distribute tribbles at Egleston Children's Hospital and visiting the MDA Summer Camp. The ship provided volunteer staff for the popular "Star Trek Federation Science Exhibit" at SciTrek Museum in 1993 and has since "adopted" SciTrek as an ongoing volunteer activity. Crew members have assisted at recruiting efforts at Vulkon, Fantasy Fair, and Dixie Trek and have presented Trek-related and Fleet-related talks and fan panels at Magnum Opus Con and at DragonCon as part of the "Trek Trak" programming. The ship hosted the 21st International Starfleet Conference during the summer of 1995.



USS MacLeod ◆ NCC-10524 Fleet Captain Kathy Webster 21 Spencer Drive Ellenwood, Georgia 30049 (770) 507-6381 As the USS *Republic* grew, it became apparent that other **STARFLEET** chapters were needed to serve metroplitan Atlanta-area Trekkers. The Shuttle *MacLeod* was formed in December 1991 for southside Atlanta Fleet members. At commissioning ceremonies at Vulkon in February 1993, the USS *MacLeod*, NCC-10524, took its place as the newest ship in Region 2. It is only the fourth Ambassador-class vessel commissioned in the Fleet.

The crew of the *MacLeod*, which includes a large Klingon contingent, has helped staff recruiting efforts at Dixie Trek and participated in the annual Muscular Dystrophy telethons. Crew members collected relief items for distribution to the

victims of Florida's Hurricane Andrew. Other community involvement for MacLeod members includes service with Electrical Eggs (working handicap services at cons) and Scottish Rite Children's Hospital. Joint Starfleet Atlanta projects with the USS Republic have included con recruiting, participating in the "Trek Trak" panels and discussions at Dragon Con, and picnics at Stone Mountain Park. Members of the MacLeod participated in presenting the 21st annual Starfleet International Conference in July of 1995.

When off-duty, *MacLeod* members make their own uniforms and have been known to sling-shot into the past to enjoy a visit to the Atlanta Renaissance Festival.






